

Donate to Support NSCF's Commitment to an Exhibit at San Diego Freedom Park

The Navy Supply Corps Foundation's mission is to *provide programs and services to support the Navy Supply Corps Community and promote its heritage and traditions*. To that end, the Foundation regularly reviews projects that can increase Supply Corps visibility and share the history of our Community.

The downtown San Diego waterfront Embarcadero area is undergoing a five-billion-dollar upgrade when you include the construction at Manchester Pacific (on the NSC/FLC footprint), Seaport Village and Navy Pier. Already built is the new Navy headquarters building for the offices of the Navy Region Southwest Command and the Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southwest (NAVFAC). Where the NSC Headquarters and its warehouses used to be, a thousand-room hotel complex and multiple high-tech office buildings will be built. Adjacent and south of Navy Pier, is the Seaport Village complex. Over the next ten years, it will undergo a complete makeover. The NSC/FLC warehouse on Navy Pier will be demolished next year and, on its footprint will be a parade ground, monuments, and parking for the largest Veteran's Park on the West Coast. The nearly 10-acre San Diego Freedom Park will open in 2028.

The plan for SD Freedom Park includes the inlet opening to San Diego Bay plus the pier and land area on either side of the inlet. USS Midway Museum is tied up on the south side of Navy Pier. South of the inlet are the "Kissing Sailor" statue, the Bob Hope exhibit and the Navy Memorials dedicated to Naval actions during WWII.

North of the inlet is the one-thousand-foot-long Navy Pier, jutting into San Diego Bay which is west of North Harbor Drive. On SD Freedom Park are to be a parade ground with a Medal of Honor statue in the middle, parking, and several other memorials dedicated to veterans plus paths, utilities, and seating for visitors to view the bay and ships going to and from the San Diego waterfront and the Naval Station.

The Story Panel Exhibit proposed for the southeast end of the pier parade ground and adjacent to the entrance to the museum is to be a 60 foot-long 8-foot-high memorial exhibit of approximately 12 panels. It will celebrate the history of the pier where Supply Officers, Enlisted, Civil Service personnel and other veterans loaded supplies and personnel onto ships who deployed to the Pacific to protect our freedom.

The Navy Supply Corps Foundation has committed to donate toward this display and receive a “Naming Opportunity” for its donation.
